Feral pigs, crazy ants, water hyacinths, zebra mussels, brushtail possums and other 'invaders' will be in the spotlight of the competition, which was made possible thanks to the generous support of Fujifilm. Professional and amateur photographers are invited to submit their photos to the competition until 22 October 2004. The winner will receive a cash prize of US\$ 1'000 while the ten best photos will be displayed at the upcoming 3rd IUCN World Conservation Congress, which will look in particular at ways of coping with alien invasive species through its "Biodiversity Loss and Species Extinction - Managing risk in a changing world" theme. OF INTEREST - TRIPS:

- **Sequoyah Caverns Trip**

As I stated at the last meeting, I spoke with the manager of Sequoyah Caverns near Mentone and he will permit us to go into the cavern for two hours with tripods to take photos. The time will have to be after 5:00 p.m. since they give tours to the general public until that time. We are planning a trip for the winter some time, probably in January (I'll have to make sure they are open at this time of the year. If not, we will go sooner). For those interested, we will plan a day trip to the area, likely seeing waterfalls and other natural features, and culminate the day at the caverns. Those who do not wish to make a day of it can meet us at the caverns at the specified date and time. Sequoyah Caverns Park has fallow deer, potbelly pigs, goats and a few other animals in fenced areas. We may stop there early to photograph them, depending on the groups interests.

The trip into the caverns will cost \$200 (\$100 per hour--they have someone accompany us). After I announce

the date, the first 19 people to sign up (I'll be the 20th) and pay me \$10 will attend. If we don't get 20 people, which is unlikely since 10-15 people expressed interest at the last meeting, then each person will have to pay their share of the amount we are short of the \$200. If more than 20 wish to go, I will schedule another date for a trip into the cavern.

Recently I took a trip into the caverns. It has some beautiful formations. I was only able to use flash since they don't spend the time during a normal visit for people to set up a tripod. I will be showing some of my slides during the break in the next meeting while the judge is reviewing the competition slides.

Stay tuned for further details. Sign up will be at a future meeting and will be announced in the newsletter unless we don't have time to wait for the next one to come out. I guess this is some incentive for members to come to upcoming meetings. Bill Gates

Provided the weather cooperates, all stages of the eclipse (7pm to 1am) will be visible.
